### The Impact of Grand Groups

In 2024, members of Grand Girlfriends<sup>™</sup> and Grand Guys<sup>™</sup> once again made a powerful difference through their collective generosity, awarding over \$20,000 in grants to support meaningful programs across Trinity Health Grand Rapids. These grants help create a more compassionate, patient-centered experience for those we serve.

#### **Grand Girlfriends**<sup>™</sup> awarded three grants totaling \$8,425:

- \$2,625 to the Maternal Infant Health Program to purchase educational toys. These toys help families support their baby's development at home while also assisting the care team in evaluating milestones and ensuring early intervention, when needed.
- **\$2,800** to the Breast Center to provide hot/cold packs that offer comfort following breast procedures.
- **\$3,000** to the Rockford Emergency Department to purchase distraction toys for pediatric patients, supporting developmental coping skills during emergency visits.

#### **Grand Guys**<sup>™</sup> awarded two grants totaling \$12,528:

- \$11,480 to the Heart & Vascular Department to purchase a Kosmos Plus ultrasound system. This technology will improve IV placement, reduce delays in care, and enhance patient satisfaction.
- \$1,048 to Nursing Education to purchase three IV task trainers who will give new nurses more hands-on learning time during orientation.

Together, Grand Groups members have awarded more than \$310,441 since inception—funding projects that enhance the healing environment and elevate patient care.

### Kieychia's Journey

# A Sanctuary for Healing

For Kieychia Likely, life as a professional, wife, and mother of four was a balancing act she managed with grace. Then came a breast cancer diagnosis, surgery, and a whirlwind journey toward healing—all within a remarkably short time.

Just a week after her third surgery, Kieychia stood before donors at our Gratitude Gathering event in December 2024 and shared a deeply moving story of resilience, hope and the profound impact of The Boutique and its remarkable mastectomy fitter, Shannon Cochrane.

"Shannon has been a vital part of my success," Kieychia said. "She visited me in the hospital after my partial mastectomy, bringing a bright smile and a loving heart. She introduced herself and said she'd be honored to walk alongside me during this phase of my journey."

With Shannon's help, Kieychia discovered that The Boutique was more than a place to find prosthetics or bras—it was a sanctuary. "It's where women who feel broken, sad, or traumatized come to be loved, encouraged and reminded of their beauty. Shannon assured me I was still complete, and her kindness continues to uplift me through every step of this journey."



Kieychia recounted a particularly stressful moment before an upcoming surgery when Shannon offered comforting words that stuck with her: "Stay hopeful. You're capable of overcoming anything. Your courage is an inspiration to others."

For Kieychia, The Boutique has been transformative. It helped her reclaim her confidence with personalized prosthetics, sports bras and even vibrant, fun-colored options that made her smile. "My prosthetic fits so well, it looks even better than my natural breast," she said with a laugh, reflecting on the care and thoughtfulness that goes into every item Shannon provides.

But the impact of The Boutique extends far beyond fitting rooms. Shannon and the team create a sacred space for women, meeting patients at every stage of their cancer journey. Whether it's days after surgery or 20 years later, they offer not just products but empowerment, reminding women that their choices and individuality matter.

Kieychia concluded her story with a heartfelt message to donors: "Your support makes this sacred space possible. Women like me are restored in ways that are beyond physical. Shannon and the boutique have given me more than just prosthetics—they've given me hope, confidence and the ability to feel whole again."

As we celebrate the incredible work of The Boutique, stories like Kieychia's remind us why donor support is so vital. You can help make this sanctuary of healing possible for others, and your generosity will help women like Kieychia rediscover their strength and beauty every day.

### Neuro-Ophthalmologist Solves Mysterious Case

Trinity Health Grand Rapids was able to provide life-changing care to Quana O'Bryan, a 39-year-old mother, partner and share-ride driver. Quana faced a myriad of debilitating symptoms, including double vision, imbalance, dizziness, changes in sensation, hearing loss and difficulty walking. Despite consulting several specialists, her condition remained a mystery.

#### **A Turning Point**

Quana's journey took a hopeful turn when she met Dr. Aileen A. Antonio, a neuro-ophthalmologist at Trinity Health Hauenstein Neurosciences. Dr. Antonio, who likens her role to that of a crime scene investigator, meticulously reviewed Quana's medical history, lab tests and neuroimaging. Through a process of elimination, Dr. Antonio diagnosed Quana with central nervous system demyelination, a rare adverse effect of her Crohn's disease medication.

### **Restoring Hope**

Dr. Antonio admitted Quana to the hospital for further evaluation and treatment. By discontinuing her Crohn's medication and administering high-dose steroids and plasma exchanges, Quana's condition began to improve significantly. After completing her treatment, Quana's life was transformed, and she is now feeling great.

#### A Heartfelt Thank You

Quana expressed her deep gratitude in a heartfelt letter to the entire care team at Trinity Health Grand Rapids. She thanked everyone who contributed to her recovery, from doctors and nurses to phlebotomists and environmental services staff. Quana's story is a testament to the compassionate and comprehensive care provided at Trinity Health.





### **Continuing Care**

Dr. Antonio continues to monitor Quana's condition with regular follow-up visits and MRIs, emphasizing the importance of a team approach in managing her health. If there is a flare-up of her Crohn's disease, the care team will coordinate to modify her treatment plan.

# Revolutionizing Joint Replacement Surgery with Mako Technology

Thanks to the generous support from our donors, Trinity Health Grand Rapids has introduced the cutting-edge Mako technology to enhance joint replacement surgeries.

This innovative system uses a 3D image of the joint and a robotic arm to create a personalized surgery plan for each patient, allowing surgeons to perform joint replacements with remarkable accuracy. The result is less pain and faster healing compared to traditional surgery methods.

Saint Mary's Foundation covered \$518,000 of the \$590,000 total cost of the new Mako robotic-arm-assisted surgery system for Trinity Health Grand Rapids Hospital.




# Advancing HIV Research through Donor Support

A letter to Saint Mary's Foundation supporters from John vanSchagen, MD, Regional Chief Academic Officer and Designated Institutional Official (DIO), Trinity Health Grand Rapids & Trinity Health Muskegon.

We are thrilled to share some exciting news from our Implementation Science Research Collaborative with Michigan State University (MSU). Thanks to your generous contributions, our collaborative efforts have led to a significant publication studying HIV patients.

The study, supported by Saint Mary's Foundation and conducted by Andrew Jameson, MD; Ryan Tomlin, PharmD; and our Office of Research & Innovation, suggests that stress and proinflammatory processes in newly diagnosed HIV-infected patients might negatively impact their health literacy\* and ability to follow treatment guidance. This research highlights our commitment to vulnerable populations, improving outcomes and innovative approaches to patient care.



### Impact on Patients and Providers

For patients, this research means better understanding and management of their health, leading to improved adherence to treatment plans and overall health outcomes. Providers will benefit from enhanced insights into the factors affecting patient health literacy, enabling them to tailor their care strategies more effectively and support patients in navigating their treatment.

Your support of our research with MSU is making a real difference, advancing knowledge and transforming care by bridging the gap between research and practice. Thank you for helping us achieve these important milestones!

Pharmacy Residency Program Earns National Recognition

A grant from Saint Mary's Foundation helped launch a promising new initiative at Trinity Health Grand Rapids — and it's already making an extraordinary impact.

In 2023, Saint Mary's Foundation provided funding for the inaugural year of the Postgraduate Year Two (PGY2) Ambulatory Care Pharmacy Residency Program, allowing Trinity Health Grand Rapids to welcome its first pharmacy resident, Jake Johnson, PharmD. Jake completed a full year of advanced training in ambulatory care and has since gone on to serve patients as a long-term care pharmacist in Texas. During his time in residency, Jake presented clinical research at national and regional conferences, including the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) Midyear Meeting in Anaheim, California, and the Great Lakes Pharmacy Residency Conference at Purdue University. His research was also published in the Journal of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy — a major achievement for any resident.

Even more remarkable, the residency program earned full accreditation from ASHP during its inaugural year — the longest accreditation they offer: a full eight years.

"This would not have been possible without the help of Saint Mary's Foundation," said Ryan Tomlin, PharmD, Clinical HIV Pharmacist and program lead. "We are so grateful for the Foundation's belief in our vision — and especially to Sister Rosita Schiller (who passed away in 2024), who helped champion this program from the beginning. We continue this work in her honor."



Due to the success of the program, it has secured long-term support from Trinity Health, ensuring it can continue to shape the future of pharmacy care.

The 2024-2025 resident, Ashlyn Kiebach, PharmD, is already working on innovative clinical projects and has committed to staying on as a full-time pharmacist at Trinity Health Medical Group,

Primary Care – Browning Claytor and East Beltline following graduation. The program has been notified of its next incoming resident, Madeline Gutta, PharmD, who will begin in July after completing her Postgraduate Year One residency at the San Francisco Veterans Administration.

### **New Liver Transplant Clinic in Grand Rapids**

Patients in West Michigan for whom a liver transplant may be their best treatment option now have an opportunity to begin their evaluation and testing process closer to home.

### The Liver Transplant Clinic at Trinity Health Wege Medical Center—Grand Rapids Campus.

This pre-transplant liver evaluation clinic is coordinated and staffed by University of Michigan Health Transplant Center. Pre-transplant diagnostic testing is provided by Trinity Health Grand Rapids, in most cases.

Currently, the only liver transplant centers and pre-transplant evaluation services are provided in Southeast Michigan. With the growing need for such services among West Michigan residents, this new clinic will provide the first step in the transplant process.

"We have an extraordinary stroke team trained to respond with precision and compassion when every second counts," said Dr. Muhammad Farooq, Medical Director of Vascular Neurology. "This recertification highlights our readiness and ability to deliver lifesaving care when it matters most." Trinity Health Grand Rapids also holds the American Heart Association's Get With The Guidelines® – Stroke Gold Plus award, and is part of a broader network of stroke-certified facilities, including Trinity Health Muskegon, Trinity Health Grand Haven and Trinity Health Shelby.


