2025 Community Health Needs Assessment and Implementation Strategy Priorities

A Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) identifies community assets, needs, and the current state of the health and social well-being of a community. The process requires input from those who live in the community on both identifying and prioritizing the needs that will be addressed in the three-year Implementation Strategy. Trinity Health Oakland found these four needs to be the most significant:

(Mental Health & Substance Abuse)

Access to Care
(Resource Navigation, Specialty Providers)

Food Security
(Diabetes, Obesity)

Housing
(Community Safety)

Transforming Communities Initiative: Trinity Health Oakland is one of nine communities that receives multi-year funding from Trinity Health's Transforming Communities Initiative (TCI). TCI is a partnership between Trinity Health Oakland and Oakland Livingston Human Service Agency (OLHSA) to address housing through focused policy, systems, and environment change while applying a racial equity lens to ensure advancement of health equity.

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ADDRESS PATIENT SOCIAL NEEDS

Community Interventions

Community interventions are hospital-based services, programs, and activities that promote health and healing as a response to identified community needs. They increase access to health care addressing social influencers of health (SIOH), improve access to health care services, and reduce health disparities within our service areas.

Community Health Workers (CHW): CHWs serve as a link between health/social services and the community. Their work facilitates access to services that improve the overall health and wellness of the communities they serve. In-patient CHWs screen patients for health-related social needs.

Patient Social Care Fund: Provides financial assistance for essential services that address urgent patient social needs.

Mi Bridges Navigation Assistance: Supporting individuals in enrolling in essential public benefit programs such as Medicaid, SNAP (food assistance), State Emergency Relief (SER), Cash Assistance, and Child Development & Care (CDC) by providing personalized guidance through the Mi Bridges platform.

Diabetes Prevention Program (DPP): Evidence-based, 12-month lifestyle change program for people with prediabetes.

The Farm at Trinity Health: The Farm is a food is medicine program, connecting thousands of people annually to the healing power of cultivating and eating nutritious, local food. [Learn about The Farm.](#)

Narcan Safe-A-Life Station: Located outside of Trinity Health Oakland Woodward Building, the Narcan Save-A-Life station provides free Narcan (naloxone) Nasal Kits to the community. This life-saving medication is crucial in reversing opioid overdoses. The station is available 24/7 to the public.

Community Outreach: The time our team spends supporting community events and engaging with our community members.
