

## Medicaid for Pregnant People

If you are pregnant, there are two options for Medicaid coverage: Maternity Outpatient Medical Services (MOMS) Medicaid and Pregnancy Medicaid. The income eligibility for each is 200% of the federal poverty level (FPL); your immigration status determines which Medicaid plan you can select. [View qualifying income levels for MOMS and Pregnancy Medicaid here.](#) MOMS Medicaid covers the costs of your pregnancy, including prenatal care, labor and delivery, and 2 months of postpartum care.

Pregnancy Medicaid is full Medicaid and covers all pregnancy-related care and other health care needs during pregnancy and for 12 months after the end of the pregnancy.

### Qualifying Income Levels for Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)\*

185% of 2024 Federal Poverty Levels

\*WIC Income Guidelines go into effect July 1 each year, rather than April 1 like the other programs. A pregnant woman is counted as one + the number of infants expected when determining income eligibility.

If the income is over the income limit, the pregnant woman is assigned a deductible. Persons may incur medical expenses that equal or exceed the deductible and still qualify for this program.</p>

## Qualifying Income Levels for MIChild - Medicaid

MIChild has a \$10 per month per family cost regardless of how many children you have.
